



Who we are

The Law Department of the University of Turin is the law school of the University of Turin. Nowadays, the Law Department of the University of Turin (140 researchers) has been awarded **more than 20 European grants**, 15 of which as Coordinator (H2020, MSCA-IF, MSCA-ITN-JUSTICE, Jean MONNET, HorizonEurope). The Department has been recognised twice in a row, 2018-2022 and 2023-2027, by the Italian Ministry of Universities as a "**Department of Excellence**" for the high quality of its research and its innovative and international teaching (funding of 16 million euros). The Department is part of a large international network of research Institutions of excellence and regularly collaborates with professional associations, NGOs, institutions and companies.

The team and its expertise

The Department of Law is **renowned for its research activities**, conducting **cutting-edge inquiries** into a range of legal topics, including criminal, international and European Union law.

The expertise of the team that wants to join a *consortium* is **highly specialised in criminal law** and took part a several EU funded projects, some of them as PI. As part of these projects, the team carried out several activities, such as desk research and study actual issues of criminal law at EU level.

Furthermore, the Turin University Law Department team has led several consortia as coordinator, developing solid **project management skills**.

The team has also always been highly supportive in the **communication and dissemination activities** of the projects. Routine activities carried out at the University also ensure follow-up to the projects in which the team is involved, especially in terms of **raising public awareness** and **achieving educational goals**.
