

Key Obligations for HE beneficiaries: Dissemination & exploitation of results

Article 39 –

and more

Best Efforts Commitment

- ✓ Exploit results owned or facilitate exploitation by another entity (e.g. transfer of IP)
- ✓ Use designated **online platform** (e.g. Horizon Results Platform HRP) if direct exploitation not done

Timely Dissemination

✓ Publicly share results as soon as possible

Strategic Planning and reporting

- ✓ Include exploitation & dissemination plan in proposals
- ✓ Strategy required for commercialisation or service provision
- ✓ Record keeping

Horizon Europe Regulation (EU) 2021/695



Article 39 – Exploitation and Dissemination

1. Each beneficiary that has received Union funding shall use its best efforts to exploit the results it owns, or to have them exploited by another legal entity. [...]

If, despite a beneficiary's best efforts to exploit its results directly or indirectly, the results are not exploited within a given period as established in the grant agreement, the beneficiary shall use an appropriate online platform as identified in the grant agreement to find interested parties to exploit those results.

- 2. Beneficiaries shall disseminate their results as soon as it is feasible, in a publicly available format, [...].
- 6. Unless the work programme provides otherwise, proposals shall include **a plan for the exploitation and dissemination of the results.** If the expected exploitation of the results entails developing, creating, manufacturing and marketing a product or process, or in creating and providing a service, the plan shall include a **strategy for such exploitation**. [...]



KEY FOR BENEFICIARIES

Horizon Europe – Annotated Grant Agreement (AGA)

17.1 Communication — Dissemination — Promoting the action: Unless otherwise agreed with the granting authority, the beneficiaries must promote the action and its results by providing targeted information to multiple audiences (including the media and the public), in accordance with Annex 1 and in a strategic, coherent and effective manner. Before engaging in a communication or dissemination activity expected to have a major media impact, the beneficiaries must inform the granting authority.

Dissemination: The beneficiaries must disseminate their results as soon as feasible, in a publicly available format, subject to any restrictions due to the protection of intellectual property, security rules or legitimate interests. As specified in annex 5 of the Horizon Europe Multi & Mono General Model Agreement, a beneficiary that intends to disseminate its results must give at least 15 days advance notice to the other beneficiaries (unless agreed otherwise), together with sufficient information on the results it will disseminate. Any other beneficiary may object within (unless agreed otherwise) 15 days of receiving notification, if it can show that its legitimate interests in relation to the results or background would be significantly harmed. In such cases, the results may not be disseminated unless appropriate steps are taken to safeguard those interests.



Horizon Europe MGA Article 16 Annex 5



Exploitation: Beneficiaries, which have received funding under the grant, must — up to four years after the end of the action — use their best efforts to exploit their results directly or to have them exploited indirectly by another entity, in particular through transfer or licensing.

If, despite a beneficiary's best efforts, the results are not exploited within one year after the end of the action, the beneficiaries must (unless otherwise agreed in writing with the granting authority) use the Horizon Results Platform to find interested parties to exploit the results. If results are incorporated in a standard, the beneficiaries must (unless otherwise agreed with the granting authority or unless it is impossible) ask the standardisation body to include the funding statement (see art 17) in (information related to) the standard.



DISSEMINATE RESULTS

In Horizon Europe, as in H2020, the beneficiaries:

Dissemination

must disseminate their results as soon as feasible, in a
publicly available format, subject to any restrictions due to
the protection of intellectual property, security rules or
legitimate interests.

Open science

 must ensure open access to peer-reviewed scientific publications relating to their results

Research data management

must manage the digital research data generated in the action ('data') responsibly, in line with the FAIR principles

Where the call conditions impose additional dissemination or open science obligations → the beneficiaries must also comply with those.



EXPLOIT RESULTS

In Horizon Europe, as in H2020,

- The obligation to exploit remains and is a responsibility of the beneficiaries on a "best efforts" approach.
- When specified in the WP additional exploitation obligations could be applied.
- Beneficiaries are encouraged to use the R&I results through third party exploitation (where appropriate).

 Horizon Results Platform is free & available to all beneficiaries. The main focus = results.

NEW in Horizon Europe: If, despite a beneficiary's best efforts, the results are not exploited within **one year** after the end of the action, the beneficiaries must (unless waived) use the **Horizon Results Platform** to find interested parties to exploit the results.





Dissemination VS Exploitation



The public disclosure of the results by appropriate means, other than resulting from protecting or exploiting the results, including by scientific publications in any medium.

The use of results in further research and innovation activities, including commercial exploitation such as developing, creating, manufacturing and marketing a product or process, creating and providing a service, or in standardisation activities.

Key takeaways and tips for effective D&E

- D&E is a legal obligation but it's not a "tick-the-box" activity
- D&E starts with describing the impact of your proposal at application stage
- Think of D&E ahead of the results of the project, not at the end of it
- Develop a clear, adaptive D&E strategy aligned with project goals
- Tailor your approach: use formats and channels suited to your audience (e.g., webinars for experts, infographics for the public, policy briefs for decision-makers)
- Results can be both intangible (i.e. patents) or tangible (i.e. prototype)
- Reach out to local and national partners to support your D&E (i.e. TTOs, NCPs).












Per Key Exploitable Result (KER) on HRP: essential information, driving matchmaking



Key exploitable results (KERs) are the outputs generated during the project which can be used and create impact, either by the project partners or by other stakeholders









Innovation Radar
